This year the Leica camera turns 100, and we have curated a special selection of historic cameras, lenses and accessories from across the last 100 years, for your consideration. We have been sure to include many Leica I (Model A) cameras, and many Leica models along the way, focusing on screw-mount Leica cameras and items of wartime, historical and general collectible interest.

Unveiled at the 1925 Spring Trade Fair in Leipzig, Germany, the Leica “kleine film kamera” (small film camera) was an instant success and Oscar Barnack’s dream of a small negative, big print camera suddenly sprung to life. For a century, the fascination of the Leica has held photographers in awe of the quality and design and performance of the Leica camera.

Over their history, the Leitz company has always led their field, innovating and changing the landscape of optic and mechanic design. And, the Leitz family have been pillars of the community.

During the Second World War, while conscripted to manufacture military equipment for the war effort, Ernst Leitz II intentionally hired Jewish workers, whom he quickly trained and transferred to the Leitz New York factory, to safety. Called the “Leica Freedom Train,” these efforts saved hundreds of families, and intensified after November 1938. And his daughter, Elsie Kühn-Leitz was also a champion of the vulnerable; she was imprisoned for helping a group of Jewish women cross the Swiss border to relative safety. Never once did the Leitz family seek recognition. In fact, they kept their efforts secret for many years, but it is clear now upon reflection of the company and the family, that this brand Leica symbolizes much more than simply excellence in photographic equipment.

This brand Leica is living history, and Tamarkin Auctions strives to reflect this multi-faceted story in this auction. We hope you find these items as historic, fascinating, and important as we do.


